Like frozen treats on a 100-degree day, summer is quickly melting away. For many school districts in our area, the first day of school is August 23rd. That means it's time to get back into old routines and start some new ones. Routines offer kids stability and help them develop self-discipline. Knowing what to expect—and what's expected—can make family interactions smoother, too. Here are a few tips to make the most of August's opportunities before we hit the "reset" button:

Have a family meeting before the school year begins. Review schedules and brainstorm new approaches to easier mornings, healthier eating, more productive studying, and more.

Focus on just one or two goals at a time, rather than tackling everything at once. When a new habit is in place, then move on to the next goal.

Prepare for changes to your daily routine by practicing before school begins. Create simple checklists as visual reminders for getting ready.

Empower kids to make decisions. Encourage them (in age -appropriate ways) to adapt routines whenever unexpected situations arise.

Build spiritual practices into your family's daily routine. This allows faith development to occur while children are growing in other ways during the upcoming school year.

Expand your family's faith outreach. Use new routines to help build children's faith-sharing skills. Encourage your kids to invite their friends to church and Sunday school. Welcome new friends into your home and show them Christian hospitality and love.

Most importantly, don't forget to add Jesus to your routines. When busy schedules resume, Jesus is often left out of the mix. Even if we attend church more regularly when school begins and our children move up a grade level in Sunday school, equipping children to live as disciples of Christ frequently takes a back seat during the action-packed weekdays.

Keeping Jesus front and center will help you and your family thrive in your new routines.

Ah! Great are the spiritual lessons we can learn from a tomato plant!

We planted six of them this year. Two of them are com-

pletely out of control. They are taller than I am. They grew out of their tomato pots in two weeks, and I had to construct a six foot tall wood lattice to support them. Before I got it erected, I noticed two branches were bent over under the sheer force of their own weight. One was completely severed and hanging only by a small portion of the outer skin of the vine. The other was simply badly kinked. I tied them both up with garden twine to see how they would do.

The branch that was only kinked has strengthened itself and is thriving once again. But the branch that was completely severed and hanging only by a snippet of outer skin? OVER-NIGHT, the leaves and flowers of that branch shriveled up. I cut the snippet of skin and threw that branch into a yard waste bag.

Jesus tells us that He is the vine, and we are the branches. If we abide in Him, we will bear much fruit. If we do not, we will be cast out as a branch and withered, and thrown into the fire (or maybe a yard waste bag?) (John 15:5-6)

Many of our Life Groups are on hiatus for the summer. But no Life Group member should be on hiatus from a thriving relationship with our Lord Jesus. Just as I'm expecting mountains of tomatoes this year, Jesus is expecting much fruit from each of us. We must be connected to Him for that to happen.

### Men's Corner

The next Men's Fellowship Breakfast at FBC will be on Saturday, August 5th, at 7:30 AM. Larry Wilson will be sharing his testimony. Below is the testimony of Ron Logsdon who shared his testimony at our July breakfast.

My mom and dad divorced when I was three years old. My Aunt Ruth was inspirational in guiding me to church. I was baptized at eight years of age and saved at fifteen.

My mom worked three jobs to make ends meet. She was divorced seven times. My dad was divorced five times. I had several violent encounters with step-dads while protecting my mom from abuse—from the time I was 11 to 17 years old.

Dad was Catholic and, at 16 years of age, I went to live with him and turned Catholic to please my him. But I knew shortly it was not what I wanted to pursue as my faith.

I came back to Columbus to be with my mom and graduated from Linden McKinley H. S. in 1968. Following graduation, I soon joined the Marines and was sent to Vietnam in an infantry unit. I asked God to bring me home alive to take care of my mom. I was medevacked out of Vietnam from a battle injury sustained in the A Shau Valley. After recovering, I was stationed at Quantico, VA, Marine Base where I served the rest of my four year enlistment.

Following my discharge in 1972, I joined the Columbus Police Department and later went on SWAT in 1996. I retired in 2006 with 34 years of duty with CPD. During my career, I had many close encounters with death, but, by the grace of God, my life was spared.

After failed marriages early in my police career, I married Beverly in 1993. This turned out to be the best decision of my life. She turned me back to God, and eventually we found FBC to be a real family of believers who help keep each other focused and thankful for God's grace and mercy.

Our thanks goes to the many friends here at church whom we pray for daily and whose prayers helped us through a difficult time when my daughter Tracy died in March of this year.

I don't need more to be thankful for. I just need to be more thankful for the spiritual gifts we have received.
