It troubles me to read the *Columbus Dispatch* articles citing a decline in church attendance and Christian influence. Each time a reporter writes such a negative story about the church in America they focus on an old church with a big building and few people in the pews. The truth is some churches are closing. But a new Lifeway Research survey, made in conjunction with Leadership Network, reveals that there are more churches starting every year than there are churches closing.

The Washington Post ran an article entitled, "The World is Expected to Become More Religious, Not Less." The story stated that, while in some parts of the world, religious affiliations will be declining, yet overall world religious affiliations are growing steadily and strongly.

We need only to look at new churches that are reaching out to young people to be encouraged that the Church is alive and well in our world.

This summer when many churches dismiss their choirs and cut back their services because vacations have taken away their congregation, we at FBC have increased ministries.

Student camp at *Crossings* was a huge success with 100 of our people, students, and leaders spending time in worship and Bible studies. Many students were saved. Some committed their lives to fulltime Christian service. This 4th of July, we had 300-400 people on our property for the fireworks. A prayer tent was set up and many unchurched prayed and found help for their lives. One of those families has started attending FBC.

During VBS week, we had 300 children and over 100 adults together for three hours hearing the Word of God with many boys and girls giving their hearts to Jesus. This year we have 80 of our kids, along with chaperones, attending *Kids' Kamp* at Seneca Lake for a week of worship and Bible studies. And many kids will be giving their lives to Christ.

Each week we have many of our people ministering to "Feed My Sheep" and "Jericho House" by feeding the hungry and caring for the poor. This ministry goes along with those working for the Stowe Center. Our people roll up their sleeves and become Jesus to the world.

Please, *Columbus Dispatch*, the next time you want to write an article on Christianity, pick a church like First Baptist Church. There are many dying churches, but there are many more that are alive and are excited about serving our risen Lord!

As I write this, Karen and I are looking forward to attending a neighborhood block party this weekend hosted by one of our home Life Groups. It's a great way to reach out and connect with your neighbors.

And you might find out some interesting things, such as that one of your neighbors has the same name as one of our earliest presidents and was born on the 4th of July. True story. Learned it at Home Depot.

Be Present.

I am just going to put it out there. Most of parents are busy, and I don't mean the "I have a lot to do kind of busy." I mean the kind of busy where you feel as though you don't have time to breathe and you are living off coffee and the food you took from your child's plate right before you fed them. Between work, life, explosive diapers, naptime meltdowns, and soccer practice, you don't have time to think. It is during these times that we are so caught up in life that I encourage you to make an extra effort to be present for your family.

Now I know what you are thinking. "I am with my family all of the time." Being with them isn't the same as being present. It is so easy for us to get so wrapped up in all of the tasks that we have to accomplish that we are more focused on those things during our days. We sit with our families to spend time with them, but we aren't really there mentally. So, this month, when life is busy, slow down and go for a walk with your family. You won't regret it.

The next Men's Fellowship Breakfast will be Saturday, August 4th, at 7:30 AM. Wyman Westfall will be sharing his testimony. Below is the testimony of J.W. Morgan shared at the June Breakfast.

My name is J.W. Morgan. I was born the youngest of 5 in 1957, on the same night that Humphrey Bogart died, in the same hospital, in Los Angeles, CA. I was born a month early, which was why my parents made the journey to Los Angeles. I was raised in Whittier, CA.

My mother was a Christian and my father was an atheist. My father had anger issues. He would get angry and beat my mother. Then he would leave for 3 to 5 days. I struggled as a child to understand his anger. I blamed myself and had issues with blame. I went to school with bruises through about the 6th grade. Since my dad was a teacher, no one believed me or my sisters and brothers.

In 7th grade, something magical happened. I had a substitute teacher who talked about his best friend. His best friend sounded wonderful! He said to stay after school, and we could hear all about his best friend. I stayed, and that substitute teacher told me all about Jesus. I did not have a Bible, but I went down to the store he recommended and bought a Good News for Modern Man Bible for 25 cents. It changed my life.

By the time I got in high school, I drifted away from Christ and got into drugs and alcohol. I started springboard and platform diving which I became very good at. The diving helped keep the drinking and drugs in check, but God had His hand on me in a big way. After high school, I married my high school sweetheart, but she became an alcoholic. After 11 years of marriage, we divorced.

I met Beth, my current wife, in a photography class. She walked in, sat down in front of me, and introduced herself. We went around the room saying what we liked to photograph, and she loved photographing old buildings, as did I. She likes to think she stole my thunder. Truth of the matter is, for me, it was love at first sight.

We had our first child, Stephanie, 6 months before we were married. You see, we had not come back to Christ. Our second child, Tiffany, was born 2 1/2 years later. By the time Beth and I married in October of 1992, I had long given up drinking, drugs, and smoking. I was clean but still had not come back to Jesus.

Beth and I decided when our kids were young that they needed Christian instruction. We started in Chico with the Community Church of God. We were reborn. I had been estranged from my father, and once I rededicated my life to Christ, God spoke to me in a dream. He told me I had to forgive my father. I told God in my dream, "You do not know what he has done." God's response was, "They hung my son on a cross, so you need to forgive him." After I forgave him, for the last 20 years of my Dad's life, we had a good father-son relationship.

I finished my degree and started a career with Nationwide Insurance. We had to sell our home in Chico and we moved to Sacramento. There we attended Antelope Road Christian

Fellowship. After 13 years in Sacramento (August 2016) we transferred to Ohio with Nationwide.

In 2003, I joined the Gideon Ministry. It has been a blessing to be involved in such a great ministry giving out Bibles and telling others of the love of Jesus Christ — like the substitute teacher had done for me so many years before. In 2011, I was introduced to the Kairos Prison ministry. I have served 7 weekends in California's Folsom Prison and one weekend in Ohio's Marion Correctional Institute. Teaching men who are incarcerated the love of Jesus is a rewarding experience.

As I look forward to the last 5 years of my working career, I would like to concentrate on the Gideon Ministry. I would like to encourage everyone to get involved. The Godly works you do are the painting of your soul. Paint a wonderful portrait of Jesus.
