God's Promise of Thorn-Crushing Grace 2 CORINTHIANS 12:7-10

I. PAUL'S <u>PAIN</u>

- a. Paul lived with "<u>infirmities</u>, insults, <u>hardships</u>, persecutions, and <u>difficulties</u>." 2 Corinthians 11:23-30; 12:9, 10
- b. Paul dealt with "a <u>thorn</u> in the flesh, a messenger of <u>Satan.</u>" 12:7

"Thorn" – "<u>stake</u> or spear:" a sharp, significant, <u>deep</u>, painful and limiting <u>chronic</u> burden

II. GOD'S <u>PURPOSE</u>

- A. God uses suffering to humble us. 12:7
- B. God uses suffering to <u>draw</u> us to Himself. 12:8

- C. God uses suffering to force us to <u>rely</u> on Him. 12:9-10
- D. God uses suffering to display His <u>grace</u> and <u>power</u>. 12:8-9; 2 Cor. 4:7-9

III. GOD'S PROMISE

2 Corinthians 12:9 "My grace is sufficient for you, for my power is made perfect in weakness."

a. God' grace is <u>enough</u>.

b. God' grace is enough <u>even</u> when we have unremoved "<u>thorns</u> in the flesh."

God's grace runs <u>deeper</u>, reaches <u>higher</u>, stretches broader, and lasts <u>longer</u> than any thorn Satan can ever send our way.

c. God's grace produces persistent, perfected, glorious <u>power</u>. 2 Cor. 12:9
