Karen and I really needed an immediate answer to prayer. And we got it!

Traverse City area. Think snow country. MAJOR

snow country. We drove up there during the week between Christmas and New Year's Day to celebrate a late Christmas with my mother.

That night in our motel room, we watched the weather reports. Bitter cold, lots of lake effect snow coming in off Lake Michigan, and low visibility was the forecast for the next day, Saturday, our "have to travel today" day. We had to be back in Columbus that night.

We woke up next morning to steadily falling snow and gusting winds. I asked the desk clerk if route 72, the main road east to I-75, was open. He said yes that he had just come to work on that road, but it was getting worse. Not what I wanted to hear. Karen and I talked, prayed, and set off. Our vehicle was reliable, we had two drivers, and we could take all day to travel the 450 miles.

About five miles into our journey, I began to regret our decision. Visibility dropped to about 150 feet. When the wind gusted, we could see nothing. Had to hold steady on course until the tail light of the vehicle in front of us came into view again. We were smack in the middle of what Northern Michiganders call a "White Out Squall." And I was scared. There was no way to turn around at this point.

We had asked both our Life Groups to pray for us on our trip. Now Karen and I started praying that God would give us a break in that poor visibility and get us to Kalkaska. Right after we prayed, it happened. The sun appeared through the clouds, and the winds let up. Karen and I broke out with a shout of "Thank You, Lord!" Shortly after that, we were able to tuck ourselves in behind a snow plow and follow him at about 25 miles an hour to Kalkaska.

I honestly don't know if it was the prayers of our Life Groups or our prayers that got us through that storm. I like to think both. It's not only great to have the prayer support of your Life Group, it can actually be life-saving. Are you in a Life Group with that kind of prayer support?

MISSIONS NEWS – FEBRUARY 2018

As I sit in this warm room and look out the windows, I see snow and ice everywhere. This is a stark reminder that Spring Soccer is just around the corner! Our 10th season of Upward Soccer will be underway very soon, and our campus will be flooded with hundreds and sometimes thousands of players and family members from our community, many of whom are not connected to Christ or His family. Providing a place and league for them is a great first step for building a bridge between our church and our community; however, we also want to help people take that NEXT STEP toward becoming a follower of Jesus by joining us for services here. The best and most meaningful bridge for those next steps is through relationships. God always works with people through people. Without relationships and a personal touch/ invitation, it is not likely that people will simply make their way from the soccer fields to the sanctuary.

Upward Sports is not and cannot be a "program" that our church provides — it must be a place for our church to connect with people! The best and most lasting way to build these relationships is through coaches. Our goal this season is for ½ the teams in our league to have a head coach or assistant coach from our church. You might say, "I don't know anything about soccer!" Great! We can teach you enough to help out with someone who does! If you provide the will, we'll provide a way to make it work (and a little secret: with the 4 and 5 year olds you don't have to know much!). My journey of faith has been a long journey. It began as an infant when my mother took me to church and dedicated me to the Lord. I thank the Lord everyday for a godly mother.

In high school, the mother of one of my friends passed away and I attended the funeral. Suddenly, during the service, people in the congregation began to weep and go to the altar. The pastor began to pray with them and more people continued to come which made me wonder what was going on. A woman from the church came to me and tried to explain what was happening. She used the terms Holy Spirit, Revival, and Renewal which were all new terms to me. This made an impression on me, and this was another step to my faith.

After high school, I joined the military. I remember some of the soldiers reading their bibles before bedtime. This impressed me and brought back memories of my days of Sunday school and church. Once again the Holy Spirit was working in my life.

Upon my discharge, I returned to Columbus and began working there. I reconnected with my old friends and we spent most weekends partying. One night a group of guys left the party and, fortunately for me, I fell asleep and didn't go with them. Later I learned they had killed someone that night and if I would have been with them, I also would have been convicted and sent to prison. How the Lord protected me from that tragedy. Another step in my journey to faith.

As I grew in my faith, the pastor suggested that I might consider going to Bible College. After much prayer and consideration I took the next step in my journey. Later on in my journey I decided to pursue a doctorate in marriage and family counseling in Philadelphia at Eastern Baptist Seminary.

I am thankful that the Lord has used me in these ministries and my prayer is to finish well.
