Looking Back

We can look back at 2017 with gratitude and praise to God because in our key areas of ministry, 2017 was a year of positive progress for First Baptist Church. In several key areas we saw growth to the status of best year ever at FBC:

- The number of Non-Sunday AM Life Groups increased from 16 last in 2016 to 28 in 2017. (75%)
- The number of people **baptized** grew from 37 in 2016 to **62** in 2017. **(68%)**
- Our **Genesis Worship** service attendance increased from 83 people per week in 2016 to **120** in 2017. **(45%)**
- The total number of **First-Time Visiting Families** grew from 155 in 2016 to **214** in 2017. **(38%)**
- Our total number of New Members grew from 90 in 2016 to 122 in 2017. (36%)
- The total number of **Children** participating in our **Fall Upward Sports** leagues grew from 276 in 2016 to **325** in 2017. **(18%)**
- Our **Total Giving** average grew from \$37,536 a week to **\$39,641**. **(6%)**
- Our **Sunday Morning Worship Attendance** grew from 901 people a week in 2016 to **921** in 2017. **(2%).**


Looking Forward

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I would like to report that from that moment on that all was well, but you and I know differently. God does not work that way. God has teaching points. After another week or so, my bad dreams finally went away but the mental problem of the constant replay of the event was still present. Finally, at the men's prayer breakfast in August, I told this story. Everyone talked for over 30 minutes (no judging), and when we left, everyone agreed that I needed to get my relationship with God back together. As I was walking out the door, one of my good Christian friends asked a simple question: "Have you taken it back?" It took me a second to remember what he was talking about, but then I was able to say "No." His parting comment was "Good," and then he left. That was the best 15 second counseling session I ever had. Within the next week, my mental pain was gone and my relationship with God was restored.

Lesson Learned:

- 1. When you get Mad/Angry at God, you lose.
- 2. Prayer works (it really does) and this is necessary to keep the relationship alive and well.
- 3. God takes care of His own children even when we try to go it alone.

Men's Corner

The next Men's Fellowship Breakfast at FBC will be on Saturday, March 3rd, at 7:30 AM. Rick Matlock will be sharing his testimony. Below is the testimony of Clifford Hauser from the February breakfast.

I am the new guy here at church. My name is LTC Clifford E. Hauser: U.S. Army Retired. I retired from the ARMY in 1997, from Honeywell in 2005, and from Raytheon Missile System in 2015. I have been married to Christine for 51 years and we have two boys.

I started attending the First Baptist Church of Huntington Park (a suburb of Los Angeles) soon after my birth. My mother was in charge of the nursery. I grew up attending and participating in the many activities of that church as a kid and young adult. I was baptized at around 12 years of age and was very active in youth activities. I married Christine at that church in June of 1966.

I finished schooling (BSEE) in June of 1968 and went into the ARMY in August of 1968. I was released from active duty in September of 1973 and then joined the active reserves in September of 1975. I officially retired from the ARMY Reserve in November of 1997.

My civilian job (Honeywell, Inc.) changed locations from the Los Angeles area, and I was moved to Tucson, Arizona, in 1985. And so we changed church membership to Casa Adobe Baptist Church and became very active in many parts of church life including men's prayer breakfast and ABF class director, usher, greeter, safety, and more. We moved to the Columbus area on May 1, 2017, to be closer to children and family. We started attending FBC in July of 2017.

I would like to say all went well in my walk with God, but that is not true. There are the good, the bad, and the ugly times that all of us as Christians have during our life with Christ. I will share one of the ugly parts of my life with God. I am not proud of what happened but looking back God may use this testimony to prevent others from doing the same.

On June 9th of 2016, I was on Mount Lemmon, outside of Tucson, at my communications site, helping three other people change radio antenna coax on the tower. All was going well until Milt Jensen, N5IA, fell from the 50 foot level of the tower and died in front of me. We called 911 and did CPR but it was not enough. Milt was a good friend whom I had known for many years. I lost it and started blaming God for this event. By the time I got home that evening—after a 90 minute drive from the site to home—my thoughts toward God changed. It is hard to write down what was going through my mind, but by the time I got home after thinking "God, you don't know what you did, this is wrong." I ended up very angry at God for letting this happen. Thursday night, all day and night Friday, I did not get much rest and also had very bad dreams when I tried to sleep. My relationship with God was non-existent. By Saturday morning I was not only mentally exhausted from the constant memory of this accident, but physically exhausted also. God and I were not on speaking terms. He was trying to talk to me and I was not listening. We

were not on the same frequency/wave length.

On Saturday mornings when working around the house we normally put Christian CD's on all through the day. The disc player is on shuffle so we get a variety of music. Around 10:00 in the morning (Saturday the 11th) I decided to try and get some rest and hopefully get my mental state back together. I relaxed in my chair and began listening to Christian music that was playing. I was hoping to ease my mental pain and regain my contact with God. It started to rain (Tucson monsoon season) and at the same time a song from Michael W. Smith called "Healing Rain" came on. I listened and hoped that it would soothe my pain. The rain quit at the same time as the song. I don't believe in coincidences so my thought to God was "Are you trying to tell me something?" I then remembered that the Bible teaches us that if you give your troubles to God, He will take care of them for you. So I just told God that the removal of my mental pain was now His to accomplish.

"Train a child in the way he should go, and when he is old, he will not turn from it." Proverbs 22:6


Several years ago, I was watching a softball game with my sister. We sat in our lawn chairs chatting away a sunny afternoon. Suddenly, I spotted a fly ball heading our way. Leaving Valerie to fend for herself, I jumped out of my chair and began running in the opposite direction. With a thud, the ball landed. On me. After a quick check to make sure I hadn't, in fact, died from my injury, I hobbled over to my chair. Judging from her laughter, Valerie had no such concerns. Through all the giggles and gasps for breath, she told me she looked over in time to see me leave the safety of our spot to run directly into the path of the ball. I countered by pointing out my lack of depth perception. I don't think she heard me.

I would like to say that my perception, depth or otherwise, has improved. It has not.

I still balk when I sense God asking me to wait on Him. My first instinct is to bolt. And, as history shows, rarely do I run to safety. Instead, I charge headlong into my own way, my own plans and get hurt. Quite winded (from all the running), I make my way back to where I was supposed to wait and ask for one more chance to sit quietly, waiting for Him to do His work. More often than not, I find that God wasn't even working on the person or situation that I desired to see changed.

He was using that time to work on me.

Running is not my gift. Neither is patience. But it is His, and God makes even the waiting so much more beautiful than my own fulfilled plans could ever be.
