# "My Mission In Christ"

### Ephesians 3:1-13

October 8, 2017

"Before you wake up tomorrow, thousands of lives will be changed forever. In a typical day in the United States...

- 10,799 babies will be born and <u>6,403</u> people will die. There will be 6,148 marriages and <u>3,110</u> divorces.
- 3,246 women will have an abortion and <u>3,445</u> unmarried women will give birth to a child.
- 84 people will commit suicide, <u>45</u> people with the AIDS virus will die, and <u>43</u> people will die from alcohol-related car crashes.
- 4,630 fifteen-year-old girls will have sexual intercourse for the first time, 1.312 students will drop out of high school.
- 28,206 people will be arrested, <u>4,274</u> of them for drug abuse violations.
- 3,396 households will declare bankruptcy, and <u>63,288</u> people will receive food stamps.
- 411 Americans will convert to the Muslim faith, <u>872</u> will become Mormons.
- 8 churches in the United States will close their doors for the last time, and <u>6</u> new churches will be started.

Most important, within the next 24 hours, by our best estimates, several thousand people in the United States will die without knowing Jesus Christ and will spend an eternity separate from him as a result."

C) The message declares God salvation in Christ is <u>for all people</u>.

### II) The <u>Selection</u> For My Mission: (vs.7-8)

A) Our selection for Christ's mission has nothing to do with our choosing but His <u>choice</u>.

John 15:16 "You did not choose Me, but I chose you and appointed you that you should go and bear fruit, and that your fruit should remain, that whatever you ask the Father in My name He may give you.

- B) Our selection for Christ's mission is our greatest opportunity in life. "A man is no fool to give up what he cannot keep, to gain what he cannot lose." Jim Elliot
- C) Our selection for Christ's mission has little to do with our <u>abilities</u> and everything to do with our <u>availabilities</u>.

I Cor. 1:26-27 For you see your calling, brethren, that not many wise according to the flesh, not many mighty, not many noble, are called. But God has chosen the foolish things of the world to put to shame the wise, and God has chosen the weak things of the world to put to shame the thing which are mighty.

### III) The <u>Success</u> Of My Mission: (vs.9-13)

- A) To make <u>all see</u> the fellowship of the mystery is a <u>noble</u> goal which is <u>obtainable</u> through Christ.
- B) The success is not accomplished by individual preachers but by the <u>church</u>.
