

The leaves reflected much of the light back down so that even the roof of our house was illuminated, and even the roof of our next door neighbor's home.

Jesus said if we put our lamp on a lampstand, it gives light to all who are in the house. But if the light is powerful enough, it will spill out the window of that house and light up the street outside, and maybe even the neighbor's house across the street.

How is your Life Group doing at lighting up your neighborhood? Is your "light" strong enough so that your neighbors know you are there when you meet? Have you had any of your neighbors knock on your door and ask what is going on at your place on Life Group meeting night? Let's pray that our lights are powerful enough to light up our neighborhoods.

At one time the yard was a mess, toys and bikes cluttered up the place, the flower beds looked like a compost, and my home seemed to be in a state of disarray."

Then one day it all changed. His wife and children never came home. He said, "I never took time to appreciate all God had given me." And now that they are all gone, all he had left was his home and some haunting memories of days gone by. He said, "what I would give for another day to see the kids laugh and play, to hear my wife's voice or hold her hand, to trip over toys and not care where I land." He smiled through the tears and softly said, "son, enjoy every day, everyone and everything God has given you. No matter what is going on, be thankful and grateful you have them. A yard filled with bikes and toys means that the home is filled with girls or boys who get to play, love and laugh. A vard that is not so perfect or flower beds with weeds among the flowers, just means Dad and Mom are just more concerned with the kids and each other. Trustee Ministry Report

The summer has been slowly winding down. Vacation Bible School has come and gone, the recent Ladies' Tea was a huge success, and, along with the season, our FBC Trustees have been hard at work overseeing and finishing summer projects.

Emergency repairs were made on the high-pressure oil line of the 48-passenger bus. The Chevrolet 15-passenger van has been repaired to meet Day Care standards. The Ford 15passenger van, however, could not be repaired to meet Day Care standards so the decision was made to transfer the bus to Ohio Changers to be used as an equipment storage vehicle.

The Trustees worked with Baptist Builders to install an additional speaker to the main auditorium along with the insertion of sound boards on the walls to facilitate reducing the echo from the public address system. In the main kitchen, the compressor in the refrigerator had to be replaced.

The Trustee Ministry met to give tribute to a long-time, faithful member who has served many years as Chairman of the Trustee Ministry, Bob Fulton. Bob and Joyce are moving to Florida at the end of August to live near their daughter. The Fultons have been members of The First Baptist Church of Grove City for nearly 50 years and represent the pure fundamental threads of its early members who wove into FBC history the vision and goals of FBC and their abiding faith in our Lord Jesus Christ. A tree was recently dedicated in their honor.

Men's Corner

The next Men's Fellowship Breakfast will be Saturday, September 1st at 7:30 AM. Mitch Bobo will be sharing his testimony. Below is the testimony of Wyman Westfall shared at the August breakfast.

I was born and raised on a Minnesota farm during the time period of the Great Depression with the benefit of strong Christian parents. As an infant, I was carried to a small, country Baptist church where the services were held in the Swedish language. Some time later, the church was relocated to town where the services were held in English. When I was 12, I accepted Jesus as my Savior and was soon baptized.

As a child, I attended a classic one-room schoolhouse which housed grades one through eight with one teacher and without the benefit of electricity or even running water. We did not gain electricity in our school until 1946. Conditions were not always pleasant or easy either. I recall the temperature being 40 below zero for one week during that time!

I met my future wife Jean as a result of attending a church youth rally. We were married in 1955. God blessed us with five children—three girls and two boys. We continued to work on the farm I grew up on until 1983. From my youth until this point in time, I actively served on and managed a dairy operation with more than 100 head of cattle at any given time.

In 1982, our only two sons, Brian and Paul, were tragically killed in an aviation accident while on a skiing vacation to Wyoming. This tragedy greatly tested our faith. Yet, through it all, we found God's grace to be sufficient!

In 1983, we moved to Fargo, ND, to be near our daughter, Karen, who was in college at the time. With the death of our boys, we felt we could no longer manage the production of the farm as each had been an integral part to the day-to-day operations. And so we decided to sell the farm and move to Fargo.

While in Fargo, I worked initially in service for an RV company and later as on over-the-road truck driver covering three states. In 1988, we decided to move to Mesa, Arizona, at the encouragement of some of our friends. This became an easy decision given the harsh winters of Fargo and the graduation and relocation of our daughter, Karen from that area. We resided in Mesa for nine and one-half years. While there, I did various construction work in addition to in-park mobile home sales.

In 1997, we decided to begin spending our summers back home in Minnesota and our winters in Florida. We could not have imagined this decision would last for the next eighteen years of our lives. During the summer I worked on a friend's farm in Minnesota. We decided to call Bradenton, Florida, our home during the winter. While there, I worked transporting RV's and also in the carpet and furniture cleaning business.

When our daughter Karen and her husband decided to relocate to Columbus, Ohio, to serve in the Lower Lights ministry, we chose to follow them in our retirement. A few months after arriving here, our daughter Karen died suddenly of pancreatic cancer. This was the third of our five children whom we have outlived. Again, our faith was greatly tested. And again, God's grace has proven sufficient! After arriving here in 2016, we were led of God to First Baptist Church of Grove City and have been blessed beyond measure. We have been embraced, loved, and accepted by so many people, particularly at a very difficult time of our lives. We are richly blessed to call FBC our church home!

Instead, he asked if I would serve in the infant room. Like the other pastors here, Josh is great at his ministry, but even better at seeing someone's hurt and trying to ease it. Whether through indoctrination here at FBC-GC or his own experience, he knows that serving others takes the focus off oneself.

Our church has been blessed with an abundance of sweet babies, and I rocked, held, and played with babies to my heart's content. Trust me when I say, serving is not always rocking in a comfy chair while little ones sleep peacefully in your arms. It is also picking up Cheerios from the floor for the eleventh time that day or having a toddler ask to wash her hands for the fourth time in ten minutes. How many times over the years has Jo Jones issued a reminder for her Kindergarteners to "share"? How many reminders to pray over their snack? How many toys have the teachers picked up after their class has left? God knows.

Just as He infinitely knows their hurts, He also sees our service. It is His plan and it is a good one. What are your gifts? Are you sitting on them every single Sunday? Teach or help in a Sunday School class. Maybe you work late during the week but have Saturday mornings free. *Upward* always needs referees. Are you feeling sad? Brighten someone's day along with your own by delivering baskets after church to new families. Maybe you believe you haven't attended church long enough to serve. Come a little early to meet and greet other families with a bulletin and a friendly smile.

When I got home from church, I took the dogs outside. Again, they had things to do and so did I. No tears. Just quiet

thanks to God for His comfort. And for creating such beautiful babies.
